MESSAGE

The play, or "performance-lecture" as Danial calls it, started out as an inquiry into why I've never come across a satisfying novel, film, or performance about climate change. Sure, there are some great ones that use climate change as a vessel to talk about something else, and vice versa. But rarely any that are willing to speak frankly about the big problems like holding the corrupters to task or dealing with the psychology of inaction. Why are we so afraid of being literal? Why are we so bad at telling it like it is, while big polluters go about spewing propaganda?

In the depths of rehearsals, *The Change* became a play with any number of themes. You could say it's about climate policy, denialism, friendship, care, intergenerational trauma, self-censorship, activism, and so on. But stripped back to its core, we think the play is still about finding hope in this climate tragedy. And trying to not be too serious about it. Because if you don't, you might just get a panic attack on the way home.

I have to express my eternal gratitude to my collaborators who stepped into this with me. Dennis (who took pains to understand the underlying science while soaking up almost 50 pages of text), Samzy, Ian, Ben, you have been abundantly brave.

Finally, I thank you for taking time to engage with this work and the ideas in it. If anything, climate change is too important to leave to the professionals. The scientists have done more than their fair share by educating us. The least we could do is act. So act. Tell your MPs they will lose your vote if they do not speak up. Do what you can where you're best placed to make change. If you work in corporate, ask your CSR folks to support high-impact charities like Cool Earth, which backs people in developing countries who are protecting the ancient forests that give us life. If you work in theatre, use your loud voice. But most importantly, let's stick together and take care of one another.
